The engagement of all pupils in regular physical activity	£14,600 73%	Sports coaches employed to run lunchtime clubs	<p>Coaches have been on a weekly rota and spent lunchtimes with each year group once a week. Coaches have led a variety of physical activities using a range of equipment. Some of the activities included football, circuits, multi-skills, hockey, basketball and netball.</p> <p>The impact of this at lunchtime has resulted in children being physically active for a longer period of time, a higher percentage of children taking up a form of physical activity at lunchtime and an increased participation in team games. Children have also been more physically active at breaktimes by playing and practising the team games that they have been learning at lunchtimes. This has also encouraged children to join sport after school clubs provided by the sports coaches. It also helped us to achieve the Gold School Games Mark.</p> <p>Coaches leading activities at lunchtime has also increased the confidence of mid-day supervisor staff to lead physically active activities within their year groups on the days the coaches are not there.</p> <p>There has also been a positive impact on the children in response to the lunchtime activities and it has promoted any sporting activities we have taken part in as part of the activities organised by the Thanet Passport team. This will continue in to next academic year.</p>
Increased participation in competitive sport	£750 3%	Thanet passport subscription charge (£750)	<p>We attended a wide range of sports fixtures this year, with children in Years 1-6 having the opportunity to attend sport fixtures, festivals and tournaments. We attended multiple fixtures with a wide variety of sports including, football, athletics, table tennis, multi-sports, rugby, netball, dance, swimming and cricket.</p> <p>We were able to attend events that were aimed at different year groups and specific groups of children to provide sporting opportunities for a wider range of pupils, including competitive events and friendly, inclusive festivals. The impact of this led to more children either having the confidence to show their skills when representing their school or achieving new goals. For example, children having a go at competitive netball or table tennis for the first time or using the skills they have been learning in PE and cricket club to take part in competitive cricket tournaments.</p> <p>This also had an impact on our Parents and Carers, as they were able to attend some of the events and support the children. This provided opportunities to extend our sports opportunities to the wider school community.</p> <p>Thanet passport sent regular updates about future fixtures and provide training and network meetings for PE leads in the area. This had a positive impact on our staff, as we were able to provide training on future developments in our PE curriculum and network with other schools and new opportunities.</p>

Swimming Lessons	£2,753 13%	Supporting swimming lessons and Minibuses	<p>All Children from Year 4 have attended their swimming lessons. The impact of this meant children in this cohort received their KS2 national curriculum statements.</p> <p>Staff were able to take the children in the minibus to attend the swimming sessions. The impact of the funding meant the minibuses could be refuelled and the maintenance kept up to date. The cost of the swimming pool hire was also supported by the Sport Premium funding.</p> <p>This year, we were also able to take children to the pool for competitive trials and diving practise before the Gala. The impact of this was that we had a competitive swim team able to perform well in individual and relay events. This boosted the confidence of the children performing at a high level in swimming.</p> <p>80% of our year 6 children can swim competently, confidently and proficiently over a distance of 25 metres. 80% can use a range of strokes and perform a safe self-rescue in water.</p>
Broader experience of a range of sports and activities offered to all pupils	£1,878 9.3%	Updated Sports Equipment	<p>PE equipment was updated and restocked for PE lessons. Stock was refreshed to having class sets of equipment. The impact of this meant children had new and updated equipment to use in their PE lessons and this supported children in achieving the learning.</p> <p>This also meant that the children had a larger variety of equipment to use at break and lunchtimes and introduced them to new equipment and sports that they may not have used before.</p>
