Governor's Update: Phil Morley (Parent Governor - Computing) February 2026

It's now almost 2 years since I started my journey as a Parent Governor at Birchington Primary school. It's been great to be part of the board and more involved in the school. As part of the school's ongoing commitment to pupils' wellbeing and digital literacy, Birchington Primary school continue to ensure IT & Computing are part of curricular activity across the school. We have recently invested in new tablets for Y5 to ensure safe internet access is available to more students using the latest devices. The school continues to promote online safety, and were excited to have activities running on 'Safer Internet Day' which was on **Tuesday 10th February 2026** where lessons were focused on helping pupils understand AI safely and responsibly. These resources complement the computing curriculum and support children in becoming safe, confident, digital users.

Reminder - apps parents should be aware of

Many apps popular with young people come with hidden risks, ranging from privacy issues to exposure to inappropriate content. In 2025–26, online safety organisations highlighted apps such as **TikTok, Snapchat, Discord, Roblox, Instagram, Kik** as posing concerns due to disappearing messages, unmoderated chats, location sharing, and access by strangers. We encourage families to regularly check devices, apps, review privacy settings, and have open conversations with children across the year groups about safe online behaviour. All of these apps have a minimum age of 13, so children at primary school should not be using them.

Together, we can ensure Birchington pupils learn to enjoy technology **safely, responsibly and confidently**.

Safer Internet Day 2026 was marked with enthusiasm and thoughtful discussion across Birchington, as pupils and staff came together to reflect on how we can all use the online world safely, responsibly and respectfully.

Safer Internet Day is an international event celebrated each year to promote the safe and positive use of digital technology, particularly for children and young people. This year's focus centred on understanding emerging technologies, especially artificial intelligence, and thinking carefully about how these powerful tools can be used in responsible, ethical and informed ways. The theme encouraged children to question what they see online, consider the impact of technology on others, and recognise that their choices play an important role in keeping the internet a safe space for everyone.

We began the day with a Safer Internet Day themed Collective Worship, which was both practised and confidently delivered by our KS2 Online Safety Representatives. They spoke clearly about the importance of making smart choices with AI, treating others with kindness, and knowing where to seek help if something does not feel right. Their leadership set a positive and reflective tone for the rest of the day and was a real credit to their commitment to promoting online safety throughout the school.

For the remainder of the morning, children from across the school took part in a range of engaging activities designed to broaden their understanding of artificial intelligence, with a particular focus on responsible use. Pupils were presented with a variety of real-life scenarios involving AI and worked together to decide whether each example showed a good use of AI, a bad use, or whether the answer depended on finer details.

These discussions encouraged critical thinking, thoughtful debate and an understanding that technology is not simply "good" or "bad", but must be used carefully and with clear purpose.

Key Stage 2 pupils also participated in a BBC Live Lesson, which explored the careful decisions involved in responsible AI design. Children learned about the importance of selecting reliable, accurate and unbiased training data, as well as how system prompts can be written to prevent 'bad' AI behaviour. During the lesson, pupils even worked together to help programme an actual AI chatbot, which simulated a conversation with a critically endangered Hooded Vulture. This exciting activity helped bring the learning to life and showed how AI can be used positively to educate and raise awareness about important global issues.

In addition, Year 6 pupils were visited by PCSO Nathan Prentice from Kent Police, who spoke to them about online safety and the legal implications of misusing AI and digital technologies. This session provided a valuable real-world perspective and helped pupils understand that their actions online can have serious consequences, both for themselves and for others.



Overall, everybody had a very informative morning filled with discussion, curiosity and learning. Our Computing Governor, Phil Morley, and Miss Kirkpatrick had a wonderful morning touring the school and seeing all the fantastic work that was taking place. Safer Internet Day 2026 was a great success at Birchington and reinforced our shared commitment to helping children become confident, responsible and thoughtful digital citizens.

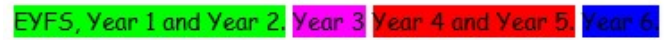

Missing school affects your child's learning and development. Currently 14.9% of our pupils are 'Persistently Absent' - (missing 10% or more of school). We understand that sometimes children are too poorly to be in school, however, even a few days of absence here and there can quickly add up and really does impact your child's progress and wider development.

A week of absence means your child will miss some of the following....

A MESSAGE FROM MORGAN SINDALL BUILDING CONTRACTORS



"Works are progressing well on our side of the hoarding, with several key activities now underway. Nearer to our site offices, we have begun the installation of the ground source heat pump system within the existing car park. This involves drilling nine boreholes, each reaching a depth of 224 metres. Once complete, these boreholes will contain a closed-loop network of pipes that circulate fluid deep underground, capturing the earth's natural heat. This renewable energy will then be transferred into the building's heating system, significantly improving energy efficiency and helping to reduce the overall carbon footprint of the project.

In addition to the groundworks, our demolition contractor will be preparing the Quex and Crispe building for structural demolition. Over the coming weeks, they will carry out soft strip demolition, carefully removing non structural elements such as internal fixtures, ceilings and partitions. This essential stage ensures the structure is safe, clear, and ready for the main demolition phase to begin."

We will be talking to the children about our new build project during assemblies on the 26th & 27th February.

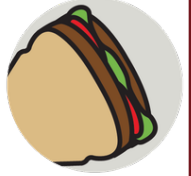

LUNCH BOX TIPS

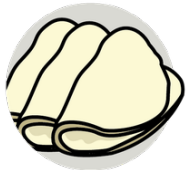
It is so important that your child has a healthy lunch. Not only for healthy body but healthy mind also. Please see the useful hints & tips below.

Base the main lunchbox item on foods like bread, rice, pasta and potatoes. Chose wholegrain where you can.



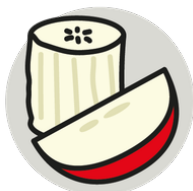
Keep a small selection of different types of bread in the freezer so you have a variety of options - like bagels, pittas, granary, wholemeal and multigrain.

Wraps and pots of fillings can be exciting for children when they can make them. Dipping foods are also fun and a nice change from a sandwich each day.



Pick lower fat fillings such as lean meats, fish, low fat spread, reduced fat cream cheese/hard cheese. Try to avoid using mayonnaise in sandwiches.

Cherry tomatoes, sticks of carrot, cucumber, celery and pepper all count towards their '5 a day'. Adding a small pot of hummus or dips may encourage children to eat veg.



Try chopped apple, peeled satsuma segments, strawberries, halved grapes or melon slices to make it easier to eat. Add a squeeze of lemon to stop the fruit from going brown.

Swap cakes, chocolate, cereal bars and biscuits for malt loaf, fruit breads or fruit (fresh, dried or tinned - in juice not syrup).



Get your kids involved in preparing and choosing what goes in their lunchbox. They are more likely to eat it if they have helped to make it.

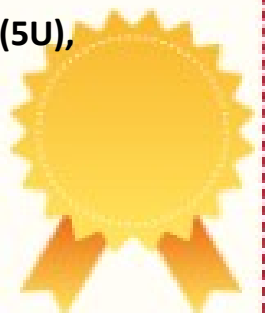

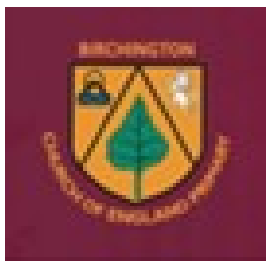
